May 18, 2005	To authorize the enforcement of Michigan traffic laws on all private roads and parking lots that are publicly accessible, if signs meeting the requirements of the uniform manual of traffic control devices are posted on it.	Assigned PA 549 of 2006. Effective 12/29/06.
HB5241	Palmer	Revise school bus speed limit law.	September 28, 2005	To revise references in the law that provides penalties for school bus drivers who violate speed limits to reflect the speed limit law changes proposed by HB5240.	Assigned PA 86 of 2006. Effective 4/3/06.
HB5661	Nofs	Allow auto insurance companies to provide a price discount to drivers age 50 or older who complete a certified accident prevention education driver safety course meeting the standards contained in HB 5663.	February 9, 2006	To allow auto insurance companies to provide a price discount to drivers age 50 or older who complete a certified accident prevention education driver safety course meeting the standards contained in House Bill 5663.	Assigned PA 610 of 2006. Effective 1/3/07.
HB6009	Elsenheimer	To make a third drunk driving offence occurring anytime during a person's life, a felony potentially subject to up to five years in prison.	April 27, 2006	To make a third drunk driving offence occurring anytime during a person's life, a felony potentially subject to up to five years in prison. Under current law this applies to a third offense within 10 years.	Assigned PA 564 of 2006. Effective 1/3/07.
SB1290	Gilbert	To recodify in a single updated statute the state law regulating and licensing drivers education courses, revising and updating many details of the law.	June 7, 2006	Among other things the bill would certify driver education providers and instructors, rather than license driver training schools and instructors. It would also require criminal history check of instructors, and create a "Driver Education Provider and Instructor Fund" to cover administration of the certification and oversight, funded by application fees and administrative fines collected under the bill .	Assigned PA 0384 of 2006. Effective 10/01/06.
